Gary Freeby Riparian Project Plan and Costs Estimated

I. Project Objective:

The project location description is timbered riparian habitat and stream corridor that consists of mostly native and non-native grasses and native trees. Big Bluestem, Little Bluestem, fescue and bermuda grass, are the dominate grasses, native tree species are Red and Black Oak, Hackberry, Bois de Arc, and Sumac. The project area is to be fenced with a 5-wire permanent fence to protect the stream habitat from cattle encroachment, preventing erosion and to protect the area from pollutants entering the stream.

Once the project is completed the cooperator will manage the riparian area as a food resources for migrating waterfowl, and maintain a filter strip of vegetation to filter pollutants before they enter to stream.

II. Proposed Work:

The cooperator will protect a 1.25 mile riparian stream habitat by installing 8,525 feet of permeant 5-wire fencing around the area, (see map). Prescribed grazing will be allowed during a two week period during the growing season to improve upland habitat buffer. Cooperator must first check with the Service for stocking rates if grazing will be used to manage the buffer area. All work will be performed in accordance to an in compliance with existing local, State and/or Federal regulations and in accordance with specifications provided by the Service and/or in accordance to Natural Resources Conservation Service's (NRCS) standards and specifications. The agreement term is 10 years.

Only one (1) such Extension of Time will be granted.
